TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 21

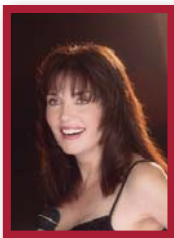

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 16

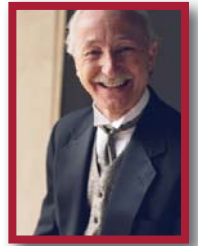

THE RICHTER UZUR DUO

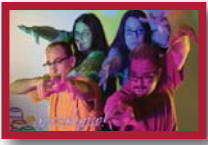
THURSDAY, JANUARY 6
