Masks Now Required at GVR Updated: 9/1/2020

Starting Monday, August 17, 2020, and for the foreseeable future, masks will be required for all persons over age five (5) who are on GVR property.

Indoors: Masks that cover the nose and mouth are required at all times; no exceptions, no exemptions.

Outdoors: In outdoor spaces, some exemptions will apply. Masks are required in all spaces at all times except when one is:

- Engaged in vigorous outdoor exercise (on the tennis, pickleball, or volleyball courts, for example).
- Swimming (defined as having the entire body suspended in the water while being propelled from one place to another by means of arm, leg, or trunk movement).
- During your water activity, if your chin and cheeks are consistently wet, you do not need to wear a mask.
- Exempt per the following three conditions listed in the Pima County mask ordinance Section 2:
 - a. Children under the age of 5. Parents or guardians are responsible for ensuring that children between the ages of 5 and 17 wear appropriate face coverings when required under this Resolution.
 - b. Persons who cannot medically tolerate wearing a face covering. A person is not required to provide documentation demonstrating that the person cannot medically tolerate wearing a face covering.
 - c. Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.

Why now?

Requests are increasing for GVR to resume access to studio spaces, classes, lectures and the like. Like most other businesses and organizations, GVR understands that masks, in addition to social distancing and other measures, are necessary when people gather indoors. The mask rule will allow GVR to move forward with plans to resume an adapted recreation program.

GVR is applying for certification through a Pima County program that endorses businesses as "Ready for You", meaning the business complies with a number of contagion-control protocols that are designed to reduce the risk of contracting COVID-19 while on the premises. This Pima County program requires coverings over the nose and mouth.

When GVR is permitted to reopen the fitness centers, all users will be required to wear a mask, per the Arizona Department of Health Services

SOCIAL DISTANCING REQUIREMENTS WILL CONTINUE, INDOORS AND OUT!

Failure to abide by these rules, engaging in verbal or other harassment of GVR staff for implementing these rules, or refusal to produce a valid member ID will result in suspension of GVR privileges.
